#### **Daily Devotions for The Way of Love Week Four: PRAY**

Take 10 minutes and sit in a comfortable chair. Breathe in and exhale deeply, paying attention to the motion of your breath. Allow yourself to imagine God's presence surrounding you as you pray. Read slowly the passage below, several times. As you rise from your time of prayer, know that Jesus remains with you always.

#### MONDAY, October 15, 2018

I Samuel 3:10

So (the child) Samuel went and lay down in his place. Now the Lord came and stood there, calling as before, 'Samuel!' Samuel!' And Samuel said, 'Speak, for your servant is listening.'

Are there times and places in your week when you 'lay down in your place' and listen for the voice of God in scripture, in worship or in the words of others in your life who are followers of Jesus?

Prayer:

Loving God, help me to set aside time each week when I can pause, breath and listen to your loving, liberating and life-giving words found in the Bible, hymns, worship or in fellow disciples.

TUESDAY, October 16, 2018

Psalm 25:4-5

Make me to know your ways, O LORD; teach me your paths. Lead me in your truth, and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation; for you I wait all day long.

In what ways do you – or could you – talk to God about who God is and what purposes and dreams God has for your life?

Prayer:

Holy God, you have made us to know you and to be your heart, hands and healing in the world. Help me to find or to make time to talk to you and listen for You in prayer.

#### WEDNESDAY, October 17, 2018

2 Corinthians 12:9-10

"... but the Lord said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.' ... Therefore I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities for the sake of Christ; for whenever I am weak, then I am strong."

Where or when in your life do you feel weakness, insecurity or incapacity?

Prayer:

Creator God, you have made me in Your image. Help me to remember in my prayers that Your power and love can fill my emptiness, heal my insecurities and abide with me in suffering.

### THURSDAY, October 18, 2018

Luke 11:1-4

Jesus said to them, "When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread. And forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone indebted to us. And do not bring us to the time of trial."

When you read these sentences of the Lords Prayer, which are the hardest for you to believe or to practice?

Prayer:

Merciful God, help me to see and to help build Your kingdom of hope, love and justice in this world. Help me to share the bread you give me and share the forgiveness You show me with others.

## October 14, 2018 Diocese of Western Massachusetts Revival

On October 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>, the Episcopal Diocese of Western Massachusetts will host revival events in Pittsfield and Worcester. The revival will consist of two services, along with several opportunities for Episcopalians to serve the wider community.

The first of the two services will take place at First United Methodist Church in Pittsfield. At 1:00 pm Eastern, the Rt. Rev. Douglas Fisher will preside and the Presiding Bishop will preach at the Holy Eucharist. The second service will occur at 5 pm Eastern at the Hanover Theater in Worcester. This service will feature music and testimonies, along with preaching by Bishop Curry on the Way of Love.

Episcopal revivals, far from singular events in the life of a region, are preceded by focused community service from Western Massachusetts Episcopalians. In Worcester, the faithful will focus on cleaning up a neighborhood park, beautifying and blessing the area, and gathering people for worship. During the month of September, Addiction Awareness Month, Episcopalians on the western side of the diocese have worked to educate their communities about the scourge of drug addiction and the hope and health available to them through ministry and treatment. The entire diocese has also undertaken the Bible Challenge, reading the entire Bible over the course of a year.

Please keep the Western Massachusetts Revival, its participants and planners, and the people of the diocese in your prayers. Selected portions of the revival will be live-streamed on the Episcopal Church's Facebook page.
